**Article**: The Legacy of Edvard Munch. A place for living, working and taking care.

When the artist Edvard Munch died in 1944 he left all his belongings to Oslo City. There were thousands of paintings, drawings, prints, photos and writings from Munch's own hand. This huge and still partly unexplored material fills the Munch Museum and its archives in Oslo.

But it is not so well known that this generous and important gift came with a condition. Munch's estate at Ekely in Oslo should be used for the benefit of visual artists. Thus 44 family houses each with a separate studio were built in Munch's garden. Ekely is now the largest artist colony in Northern Europe. So what does it mean to live and work in this artist's colony? What kind of urban space is this?

Munch's living house was demolished by Oslo City in 1960. Only his atelier is left. For many years this building was more or less closed. But from 2016 the artists in the colony got permission to use it two months every year for exhibitions, concerts and projects. How to use this possibility to create a new vibrant space?

Ekely Artist Colony and nearby surroundings are now protected by cultural heritage law. But in spite of this the area is threatened by new building plans. How to protect the legacy of Edvard Munch is still a dire question.
